“Eternal Life, True Salvation, and Why the Nations Will Take Hold of a Jew”

**“What Must I Do to Inherit Eternal Life? Christianity’s Savior’s Own Words vs.
the Christian method of Salvation”**

1. The Most Direct Question in the Christian scriptures

The NT records multiple men asking Yahshua (Jesus) the clearest salvation question possible:

“What must I do to inherit eternal life?” In other words what must I do to be saved as a Christian might ask.

This is the moment where the Christian Jesus should give the Christian appropriate answer— *if* the Christian answer were true.

Instead, every time, Yahshua gives the **Torah answer. Very important!**

2. Yahshua’s Answers in Every Eternal-Life Passage

These four passages form the backbone of today’s teaching.

Matthew 19:16–17

“If you want to enter into life, keep the commandments.”

Mark 10:17–19

“You know the commandments...”

Luke 18:18–20

“You know the commandments...”

Luke 10:25–28

The lawyer asks:

“What must I do to inherit eternal life?”

Yahshua responds:

“What is written in the **Torah**? How do you read it?”

The man answers with:

- Love Yahweh (Deut 6:5)
- Love your neighbor (Lev 19:18)

Those two commandments are a summary of the entire Torah and the Prophets. And an exact summary of the ten commandments. The first four commandments show us how to love Yahweh with all our hearts and the remaining six shows us how to love our neighbors as ourselves.

To the lawyer’s answers, Yahshua says:

“You have answered correctly. **Do this and you will live.**” In other words, do this and you will be saved and inherit eternal life.

Yahshua, the Christian savior Jesus never says in these texts specifically:

- “Believe in my blood.”
- “Have faith alone.”
- “I will die for your sins.”
- “Grace, not law.”
- “Be baptized.”
- “Eat my flesh and drink my blood ritual.”
- “Just believe”
- “Believe in my death burial and resurrection”

He always says:

- **Keep the commandments.**
- **Do what is written in the Torah.**

This is a direct contradiction to Christian salvation doctrine and shows contradictions with other texts from the NT and their Savior’s statements in other texts.

3. Yahshua (Jesus') Statement: "Salvation Is of the Jews"

This is the NT's own admission that salvation is rooted in **Israel's covenant**, not Christianity. We are seeing from these texts, that by using the words found within the NT we can prove that the Christian NT way of salvation can be proven to be error and false doctrines full of contradictions.

John 4:22

"You worship what you do not know; we know what we worship, for **salvation is of the Jews.**"

Christianity's Jesus places salvation:

- In the hands of **the Jews**, not the church
- In the **covenant of Israel**, not a new religion
- In **Torah**, not in belief in his death, burial and resurrection
- Or any other ritual, doctrine, belief, sacrament or method

This aligns perfectly with his answers about eternal life. Since the NT writings came to be as a canon possibly as late as 3 centuries after they were supposedly experienced in real time, a lot of interpolations and redactions were being made to adjust to Greek and Roman belief and the newly forming Christian religion. Christianity is a heathen religion with pagan and heathen beliefs and rituals amalgamated in with Tanakhian exegeses. With these textual overlays, the NT gets all mixed up with contradictions. These contradictions reveal that some of the text is most likely true. Separating it out requires comparing it with the Tanakh. This is and can be very difficult as many Tanakh texts were repurposed by Christianity to create a false narrative. In other words, texts from the Tanakh did not originally mean what Christianity makes them out to be, but in order to validate the new religion, Christianity went back and took Tanakh texts and then added them into the narrative of the NT giving it a sense of legitimacy.

4. The Tanakh Confirmation: The Nations Will Seek a Jew

The prophets declare that the nations will one day recognize that **Israel**—not Christianity—has the truth. That Israel and the Jews have the truth not Christianity. That from the pages of the Tanakh do we find the way of truth and salvation. That Tanakh is the only true Scriptures.

Zechariah 8:23

"Ten men from all languages of the nations shall take hold of the skirt of a **Jew**, saying, 'We will go with you, for **Elohim is with you.**'"

This passage teaches:

- The nations will follow **Israel**, not replace Israel as in Christianity's replacement theology.
- The nations will seek **Torah**, not some new gospel.
- The nations will recognize **the Jew** as the one who knows Elohim..
- The nations will not bring to Israel a new religion—they will join Israel's beliefs and Elohim.
- That the missionaries trying to convert the Jews to Christianity is in error

This matches Yahshua, the Christian Jesus' statement: "**Salvation is of the Jews.**" **In other words, the Jews have the necessary information and methods for salvation.**

5. Bringing the NT and Tanakh Together

When you place these texts side-by-side, the conclusion is unavoidable:

The NT and the Christian savior's own words:

- Eternal life = **keep the commandments**
- Salvation = **of the Jews**
- Torah = **the path to life**

The Tanakh's words:

- The nations will take hold of a **Jew**
- Because **Elohom is with him**
- And they will follow **Israel's covenant**

The unavoidable conclusion

The Christian Jesus' own teachings **deny** the Christian mode of salvation and **affirm** the Torah path preserved by Israel. These are major contradictions within the NT on the most important topic in the NT.

Christianity says to be save here is the methods:

- "Faith alone."
- "Not the law."
- "Believe in the blood."
- "Be baptized"
- "Partake of Communion, the bread and the wine"

But none of these can be true and a form of methodology if at the same time we read that their own savior says you want to inherit eternal life then:

- “Keep the commandments.”
- “Do what is written in the Torah.”
- “Salvation is of the Jews.”

The Tanakh says:

- “The nations will take hold of a Jew.”
- “Elohim is with you.”

These things are showing us that the Jews and Israel had it right all along. In the finality of it all, the Jew’s method of salvation is found to be correct and that all along Christianity’s method of salvation was in error.

6. The Nations Will Go Up to Learn Torah With Joy

The prophets describe a future where the nations are **excited** to learn Torah—not reject it.

Isaiah 2:2–3

“All nations shall flow to it... ‘Come, let us go up to the mountain of Yahweh... for **out of Zion shall go forth the Torah.**’”

Micah 4:1–2

“Many nations shall come and say, ‘Come, let us go up... He will teach us His ways, and we will walk in His paths.’ For **the Torah shall go forth from Zion.**”

Isaiah 66:23

“From one Shabbath to another, all flesh shall come to worship before Me, says Yahweh.”

The nations will:

- Go up to Zion
- Seek Yahweh as the most high Elohim
- Learn Torah
- Keep Torah with joy
- Worship Yahweh on His Sabbaths

This is the exact opposite of Christian doctrine, which teaches the Torah is abolished.

If the Christian savior says eternal life comes through **Torah**, and that salvation is **of the Jews**, and the prophets say the nations will follow **Israel**,

Then every person and more to the point every Christian must choose:

- **Follow Yahshua's (Jesus) actual words**, which is Torah based, Tanakh only Scriptures,
or
- **Follow Christian theology**

They cannot do both.
